Dr Damon's maternal line weaves a testament to women empowering women across generations. In the late 1700s, Trijnje (Katryn Kaffer) ignited a legacy of unyielding strength, forging a powerful maternal line that would empower women for generations to come in the Cape Colony. Her daughter, Sara Cloete, inherited her mother's courage and determination, passing it down to Sara Maria Cloete, who then bestowed it upon Anna Jacomina Christina Basson. Anna's daughter, Martha Maria Cloete, embodied compassion and kindness, traits that would become hallmarks of this extraordinary lineage. Martha's daughter, Martha Maria Jacoba Smith, inherited artistic talent, further enriching the family's cultural heritage. The torch of strength was carried forward by Eleanor Denise Cyster, who passed it to her daughter, Genevieve Eunika Marí Damon. Genevieve, in turn, illuminated the path for her own daughter, Gia Ella Madge Bester, now, just 10 years old. These stories are a testament to the transformative power of women empowering women across generations, a shining tribute to the unbreakable bonds of maternal love and legacy.

Dr Damon is a renowned educator author, historian and storyteller from the Pniel Mission Station in the Western Cape with a teaching career spanning four decades.
